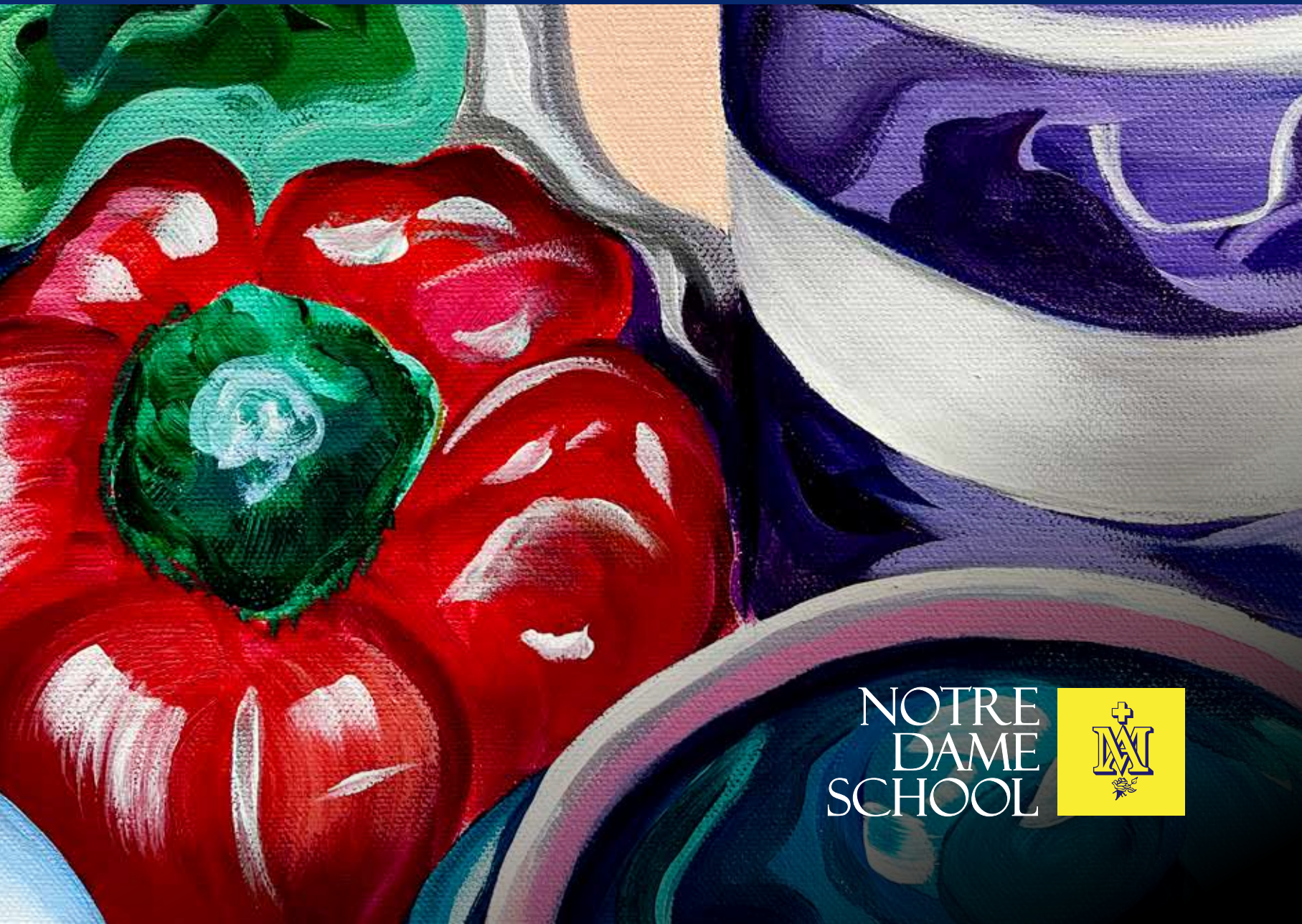

ANOTHER YEAR OF OUTSTANDING SUCCESS

The following pages highlight our impressive sporting accolades and performing arts achievements, as well as our wonderful art and textile work. Also included is an update about our impressive alumnae, who have supported and inspired our ND6 pupils.

At Notre Dame, we encourage competition, curiosity and creativity in equal measure, ensuring that all ambitions are inspired and supportively achieved across the curricular and co-curricular programmes. Our students have embraced a plethora of opportunities from our 'Young Engineering' programme to printmaking, cross country, robotics and even crochet!

Our Prep students brilliantly qualified for four national finals last year including biathlon, cross country and swimming (gaining a silver medal in the Olympic swimming pool at London Aquatics Centre). We have enjoyed fantastic dance, drama and musical performances with Nursery and Infant nativities, productions, a Year 5 *Romeo & Juliet* and *West Side Story* showcase, carol services and spring concerts. Our creative STEAM team has developed an exciting curriculum encompassing robotics and stop-motion animation, alongside other engaging and interactive learning activities in the newly refurbished Prep art and ICT rooms.

On a practical level, we have extended our wraparound care to offer further flexibility for families to access School between 7.30am and 6pm daily for both Nursery and Prep. We are now also welcoming two-year-olds in our Nursery to allow the children's education journey to begin earlier.

The excitement continues with further STEM focus embedded in the Senior curriculum. We marvelled at the 'CanSat launch' and Lego robotics programme. Our Senior students once again took part in the British Science Association's CREST awards, with superb research-based experiments including projects such as rocket cars, the chemistry of food, the properties of carbon dioxide, sound and electricity. This was alongside other scientific competitions such as the BPhO Senior Physics Challenge, debates, masterclasses and other engaging activities. Our music department has expanded to offer three choirs and two orchestras and we arranged our first entry to the national GSA choir competition. This year, we welcomed two new sport specialists to our teaching

staff. Our new Head of Hockey and Head of Netball are providing specialist training and they continue to expand our fixtures. We were treated to an incredible performance of *Macbeth* by Years 8 and 9 for parents in the Montaigne Theatre. Meanwhile, the Year 11 students performed this as part of their literature revision. Our ABC students completed special projects on their favourite subjects and interests, which are now on display in the Library.

Our new state-of-the-art, two-storey ND Innovation Space in the heart of the Senior School was launched by Sister Maria and last year's Head Girl, Holly Fletcher. Our investment in the latest technology housed within this learning space will be available across all subjects and disciplines, offering our students and staff access to the latest technology.

We have enjoyed an exciting and busy year at Notre Dame. Whilst we have included as much as we can within this extended *Review*, these are the key highlights of life at our wonderful School. We regularly celebrate our students and are proud of every achievement. We hope you enjoy reading the *Review* as much as we have.

2024 has been no less exciting, with the girls relishing another year of engaging enrichment opportunities. It has been a real pleasure watching them making memories with their friends.



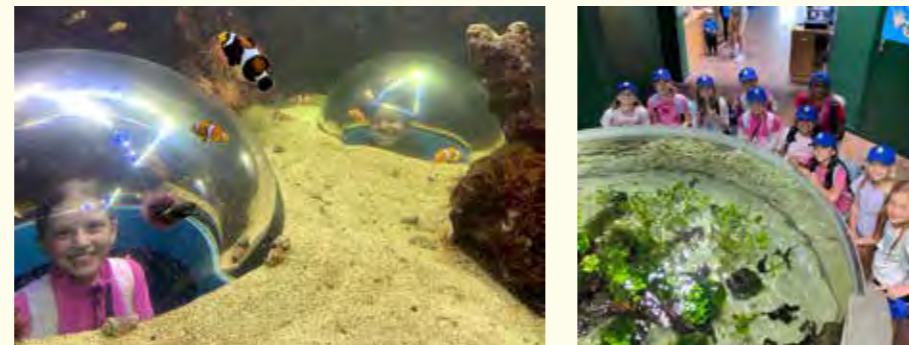
YEAR 3 INVESTIGATES LIVING RAINFOREST

Senior Drama to *A Christmas Carol* at The Old Vic

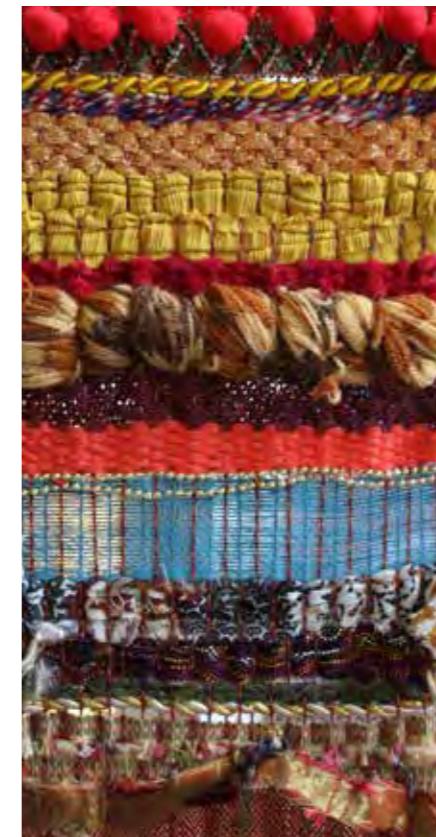
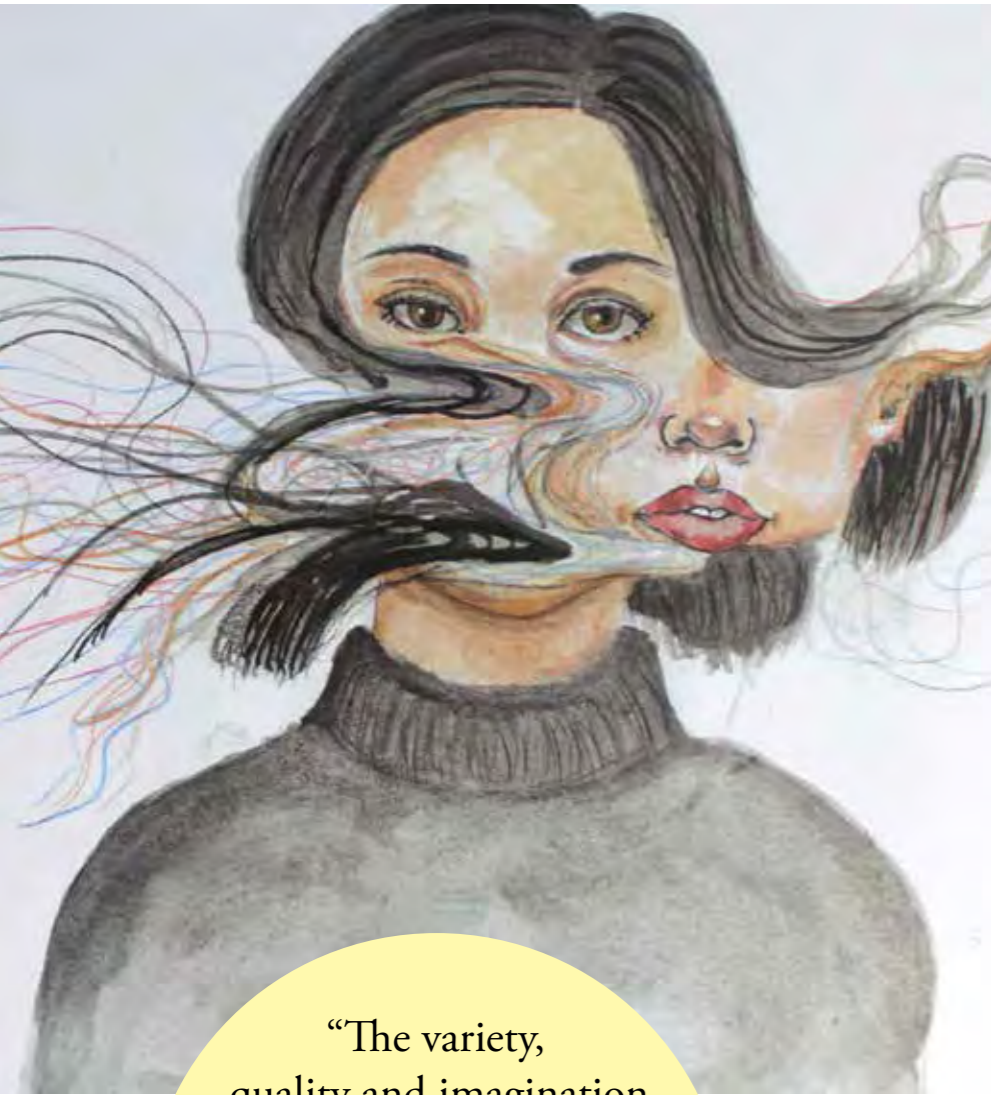
GCSE AND A LEVEL ART & TEXTILES 2023

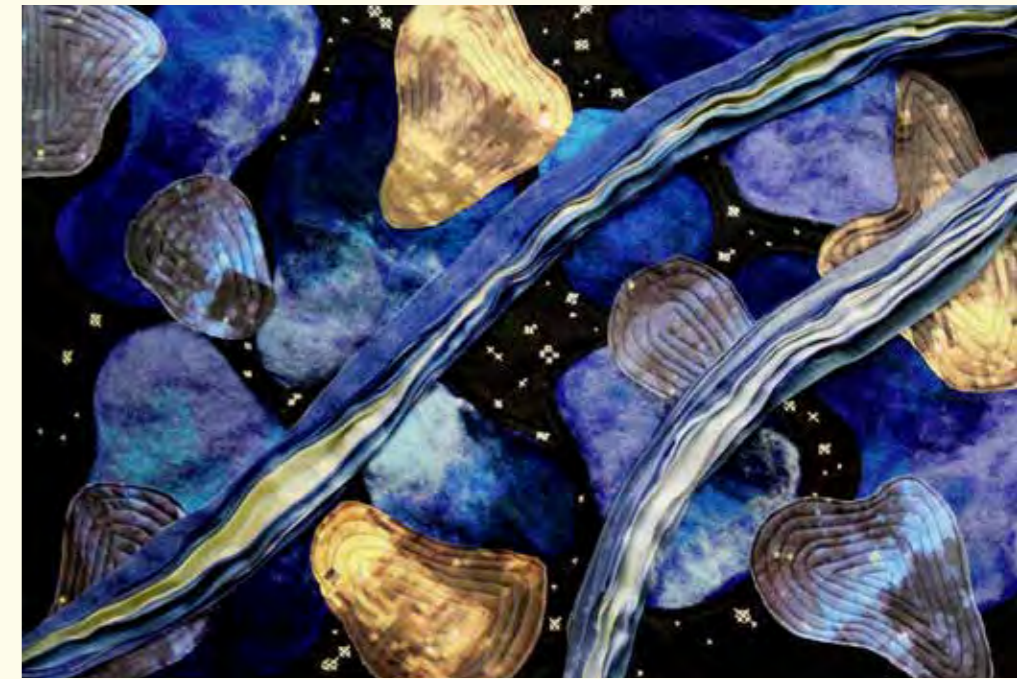

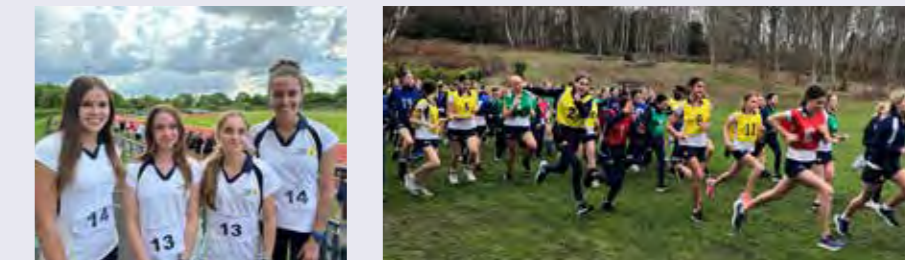

We have more than 320 individual memberships of around 30 rehearsing musical groups, providing for all abilities, offering bespoke music in choirs, ensembles, bands and groups from Pre-Prep to above Grade 8. Ensembles combine to accompany each other in the Carol Services and Spring Concerts, performing unique arrangements of traditional and contemporary music from around the world.

A range of expert instrumental teachers offer a plethora of different instrumental and singing disciplines. Our multiple instrumental lessons each week represent an extremely high take-up over Years 1 to 6. Every class in the Prep School creates a 'Faith and Music' assembly each year where pupils take up the opportunity to perform solos and duos, others providing readings and prayers.

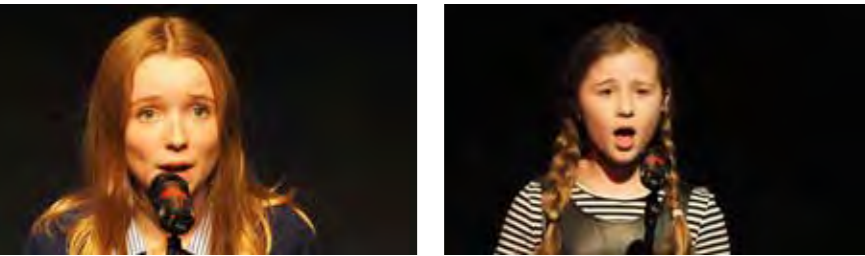

IN THE LESTONNAC ETHOS

There is an underlying ethos at Notre Dame that pervades all we do, born of our foundations within the Company of Mary Our Lady. We call it the Lestonnac Ethos; it is what makes us unique...

In 2023, the ND6 Chaplaincy reps led and supported the charitable work of the School in a number of different ways. The School undertook fundraising for our charity *ODNs Cobham Outreach*, *Royal Marsden Hospital*, and the *Motor Neurone Disease Association*. Chaplaincy reps promoted understanding of the work of these charities and raised money in a variety of ways, including selling 'disco refreshments' to the younger students.

In 2023-2024, the Chaplaincy reps chose *Little Village* as the School's charity, alongside *ODNs Cobham Outreach*. They organised for the School to collect donated pyjamas and gift sets for pre-school-age children across London, who are supported by *Little Village*. They learned about the work of the Cardinal Hume Centre in Westminster as part of their Reflection Day, and collected essential items to donate to their Food Bank. This was in addition to the School's annual support of the Cobham Area Food Bank.

Early in 2023, we were moved by the plight of people affected by the earthquake in Turkey and Syria. Through donations and a non-uniform day, students raised £1275 for the Disasters Emergency Committee appeal in response to this event. During Lent, the students supported the Cardinal Hume Centre in Westminster. Students and their families donated store gift cards, to be given to residents in hostel accommodation, and many boxes of essential food items, to be given to people in Westminster at risk of homelessness. During the Autumn term, the School celebrated Harvest in both 2023 and 2024 and held our customary collection of donations for the Cobham Area Foodbank. As in previous years, this was extremely well supported with multiple crates filled with tins, jars, packets and bottles being donated.

In the lead-up to Christmas, pupils in the Prep School donated gifts for residents at Whiteley Village. Students in Years 1 and 2 wrapped the presents individually, and the residents loved opening them at their Christmas party. It was lovely to see photographs illustrating the joy that was brought to residents as a result of our students' generosity. It was also wonderful to see the joy spread as the Year 1 and 2 students performed their Nativity to the audience of residents.

At the same time, students in the Senior School responded with great generosity to an appeal by Little Village. Little Village had put out a request for donations of new or good-as-new pyjamas or sleep suits for babies and pre-school-age children. We were delighted to collect and donate a large number of items, many of which were combined with a picture book or cuddly toy.

BORDEAUX PILGRIMAGE 2023

During the October 2023 half-term, a group of 17 members of staff and governors undertook a pilgrimage to Bordeaux, the home of St Jeanne de Lestonnac, the foundress of the Company of Mary Our Lady. It was a privilege for the staff and governors to visit places associated with her life, and to pray in the different churches which marked key events throughout her life. The participating staff and governors returned inspired and renewed by St Jeanne's example, which we strive to emulate in all we do at Notre Dame.



■ NEW INNOVATION HUB

We are thrilled to have opened our new state of the art building – ND INNOVATION Space. The building was launched at the beginning of November, where Sister Maria and 2024's Head Girl, Holly Fletcher cut the ribbon.

This new inspirational facility sits in the heart of the Senior School and boasts two storeys of cutting-edge technology and an additional two science labs. This fabulous new learning space will be used across all subjects and disciplines, to bring further STEM focus to our creative curriculum.

The ground floor houses the Innovation Space, which is already being used to host lessons, clubs and project work. Students will be taught how to use the technology available to let their imaginations go wild. They are getting to know the latest Surface Pro computers, CAD/CAM software, 3D printers, laser cutters, thermoplastic modelling and robotics. The new green screen 'cove' has already provided hours of entertainment, as the girls wonder at how the equipment can be used to create podcasts and movies, streamed onto the giant wall screen.

The first floor contains two new multi disciplinary science labs which are already in use and enhancing the existing physics, chemistry and biology labs. These labs are divided by a folding wall, which enables smaller practical classrooms for collaborative working or one large classroom for scaled up experiments, demonstrations, lectures and presentations.
